The classroom space is not immune to the marginalizing dynamics which structure broader society. Ample research work has documented the exclusion and devaluation experienced by students from marginalized groups (in terms of their racial or gender identity, social class, sexuality, or disability) and the related impact on their learning capacity, success, and professional trajectory. The classroom is thus a space where social inequalities are reenacted.

For its second edition, IRIPII's Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) conference will focus on the strategies that allow for greater EDI in the college or university classroom.

What are the obstacles to EDI in the classroom and in the teacher-student relationship? How do students from marginalized groups experience exclusion and discrimination in the classroom? What are the challenges for postsecondary teachers? What are some innovative, exemplary, or generative pedagogical practices allowing teachers to establish an inclusive learning community? And how to make the classroom into an inclusive, antioppressive and emancipatory space? Our conference will answer such questions through the complementary insights of our speakers and panelists. It is thus intended for any postsecondary québécois and canadian teacher looking for tools and insight to better integrate EDI in their pedagogical practice or who simply want to know more about it.
